Unified Scenario Simulation

Getting Started with an SAP S/4HANA Conversion

Business context

Company Background

Halvorsen Foundry in Vaasa, Finland casts metal fittings and runs an older on-premise SAP system. It has decided to move to SAP S/4HANA and wants the team to understand the fundamentals before any technical work begins.

Team Setup

A small team of a basis administrator, a finance lead, and an external consultant has formed. None of the internal staff has run a conversion before, so the consultant is guiding the early sessions on how a conversion is structured.

Current Situation

The team keeps confusing a conversion with a simple upgrade and is unsure which tool performs the technical steps or in what order the systems should be handled. The consultant wants these basics clear before planning.

Current Constraints

The business can tolerate only a limited outage and expects its existing configuration and history to be retained. The team must plan with those constraints in mind rather than assuming a clean restart.

Improvement Goals

The near-term goal is a shared understanding of what a conversion is, which tool executes it, and how to sequence the landscape, so later planning rests on that foundation rather than guesswork.

Your assignment

You are advising the Halvorsen Foundry team in their first weeks of planning an SAP S/4HANA conversion. For each challenge, recommend the approach best aligned with how a technical conversion is defined and executed

1. CHALLENGE 1 — Understanding conversion versus upgrade

- Define what a system conversion changes.
- Contrast it with a same-release upgrade.
- Explain why the distinction affects planning.

- o A conversion changes product and database, not just release.
- o Maintenance within a release is not a conversion.

Brannoch Textiles is preparing the technical work to move its existing SAP system to SAP S/4HANA. The basis lead is unsure which single tool actually carries out the technical steps of the conversion, from the software update through the database migration and the data conversion, and wants to name it before planning the runbook.

Which tool performs the technical steps of a system conversion end to end?
